Proteja a su familia, hagamos un plan de emergencia

USTED TIENE DERECHOS:

- La constitución de Estado Unidos lo protege sin importar su estatus.
- Usted puede guardar silencio, es muy importante que comunique claro y preciso al oficial que usted desea ejercer ese derecho. Recuerde que lo que usted diga podrá ser usado en su contra.
- En el estado de Ohio, usted si esta requerido a proveer su nombre, fecha de nacimiento y su dirección. Esto si hay una sospecha probable de un delito.
- Usted tiene derecho de hablar con un abogado.

RESPONSABILIDADES QUE USTED TIENE:

- No presente documentos falsos o mienta durante una detención o interrogación.
- Siempre mantenga la calma.
- No corra o trate de esconderse.
- No haga movimientos que el oficial pueda considerar peligrosos.
- No ponga resistencia física en ningún momento.

El gobierno de Estados Unidos no esta obligado a proporcionarle un abogado gratuito en un caso migratorio, por eso es importante consultar su caso durante una detención o antes de llegar a ese punto.

Proteja a su familia, hagamos un plan de emergencia

Ya mismo:

Haga copias de sus documentos importantes donde sea fácil acezar y dejar las copias con alguien de confianza, como un familiar cercano.

Invierta en un folder plástico o a prueba de fuego donde pueda mantener todos sus documentos importantes, como:

- Pasaportes de cada miembro de la familia. Si todavía no tramita el pasaporte para sus niños, hágalo lo mas pronto posible.
- Actas de nacimiento de todos.
- Acta de matrimonio
- Documentos legales como tarjetas de seguro social y/o documentos de inmigración.
- Documentos de propiedades, como casa, casa móvil o automóviles.
- Tenga lista una Carta Poder, esto le dará a algún familiar o un amigo cercano la autoridad del cuidado de sus niños. Esto ayudara a evitar que los niños sean puestos al cuidado del condado o Children Protective Services en inglés.

MUY IMPORTANTE:

- Registre si es posible a sus hijos en el consulado de su país, para obtener una doble nacionalidad.
- Memorice el número de teléfono de algún familiar o amigo cercano.
- Memorice el número de teléfono de su abogado.
- Usted no le cuente o platicue de su estatus migratorio con nadie que no sea un agente migratorio o un abogado.
- En ningún momento firme nada sin hablar con un abogado. Usted tiene el derecho de pedir un interprete si no entiende lo que le están diciendo.
- Lea muy cuidadosamente todos los papeles que le den a firmar.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

DEVELOPING AN EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

RIGHT NOW: TO PROTECT YOUR FAMILY

Make copies of your important documents where they are easy to access and leave the copies with someone you trust, such as a close relative.

Invest in a plastic or fireproof folder where you can keep all your important documents, such as:

- Passports for each family member. If you have not yet applied for passports for your children, do so as soon as possible.
- Birth certificates for everyone.
- Marriage certificates.
- Legal documents such as social security cards and/or immigration documents.
- Property documents, such as a house title, mobile home or cars.
- Have a Power of Attorney ready, this will give a family member or close friend the authority to care for your children. This may help prevent children from being placed in the care of the county or Children Protective Services.

VERY IMPORTANT:

- Register your children at the consulate of your country, if possible, to obtain dual citizenship.
- Memorize the phone number of a family member or close friend.
- Memorize your attorney's phone number
- Do not discuss your immigration status with anyone other than an immigration agent or attorney.
- Never sign anything without first speaking to an attorney.
- You have the right to ask for an interpreter if you do not understand what you are being told.

DEVELOPING AN EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN TO PROTECT YOUR FAMILY

YOU HAVE RIGHTS:

- The United States Constitution offers some protections regardless of your status.
- You may remain silent, but it is very important that you communicate clearly and precisely to the officer that you wish to exercise that right. Remember that anything you say may be used against you.
- In the state of Ohio, you are required to provide your name, date of birth, and address. This is if there is a probable suspicion of a crime.
- You have the right to speak to an attorney.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Do not present false documents or lie during detention or interrogation.
- Always remain calm.
- Do not run or try to hide.
- Do not make any movements that the officer may consider dangerous.
- Do not physically resist at any time.
- The United States government is **NOT** required to provide you with a free lawyer in an immigration case, so it is important to discuss your case during or before you get to that point.

Regardless of your immigration status, you have some guaranteed rights under the Constitution.
